Inter Club Competitions and Matches explained.

For new players who want to play competitive inter-club matches, the starting point is to sign up for **FRIENDLY MATCHES**. These are open to all members, of all abilities. Friendlies are the best way to improve your skill and your knowledge of bowls etiquette and rules, as well as meet other members. See the club noticeboards to sign up as often as you like. There are home or away matches, some for men only, some for ladies only and some for mixed teams. Played at all times and days of the week. Teams are selected on a weekly basis, so you can choose to play at short notice.

Again for new players, a good starting point is the **NICHOLAS SOAMES TROPHY**, which is meant specifically to be a good introduction to playing in team league competitions, whilst representing your Club. Played on Monday evenings from June onwards, the 'Australian Pairs' format is a good way to learn about playing in different positions within a team.

Our club selectors choose who plays for our club's **LEAGUE TEAMS** as well as for certain competitions, based on a number of factors, but generally the best players are selected. Selectors consist of our 2 Captains, 2 Vice-Captains, a ladies' selector and a gentlemen's selector - a total of 6 elected people. Currently they are Keith Jackson, Jo Kaddish, Roy Walter, Linda Witcher, Paul Burnett and Kathy Smith.

Any individual can enter **COUNTY COMPETITIONS**, which are knockout competitions (singles, pairs, triples or fours) and details are available on the Sussex Bowls website. All abilities can enter. It costs about £3 or £4 per player to enter, but entries close as early as January. Winners can go on to represent Sussex and beyond if successful. Bowls England, on their website, also have national knockout competitions along similar lines.

There are a number of other competitions, some are National (organised by Bowls England) and some organised by Sussex County Bowls, some organised by Clubs who invite other Clubs to enter. Volunteers manage some of them. You are all welcome and encouraged to volunteer to manage and/or enter these events. Please speak to the current managers or any of the selectors for further details.
