
Counting in Danish: New Women's Fiction Novel Delves Into Grief, Anxiety and Family Secrets

"I have always been fascinated by how much our genes and family history play a part in who we are as people. Since learning in depth about Danish culture and life I've also come to realise the importance of one's country of birth. So much is innate from the beginning; so much never has to be explained. The traditions and values of another nation, however, can be quite difficult to understand and assimilate when first encountered in adulthood. I've explored this idea in my novel, and it is reflected in one of the main themes."

About the author:

After studying English and Education to degree level and then teaching for many years in Sussex, Hampshire and London, Celia Berggreen retired from teaching to begin writing in earnest. She'd been writing short stories, novels and poetry since she was a child, but life had got in the way and she'd never had the time to devote to it that she'd have liked. She joined The Creative Writing Programme, based initially at the University of Sussex, and threw herself into writing the novel that would become Counting in Danish.

Celia completed the two-year course and then a further year of Advanced Writing Workshops while continuing work on the

novel. She was a member of New Writing South and, later, of the Chalk Circle writers' group. She contributed short stories to Chalk Circle's 2021 collection 'Shadows on the Path', and to the literary magazine Mslexia.

Celia lived in Sussex with her Danish husband, Kristian Berggreen, whom she met on a blind date when she was a single parent juggling three teenagers, full-time teaching and a house move. Happily, he was undaunted, and they married shortly afterwards. With her trademark curiosity and zest for life, Celia embraced Danish culture, and her large, extended family of Danish in-laws and regular trips to Denmark provided some of the inspiration and background for this novel.

In 2022, Celia died of ovarian cancer. She'd continued writing until the cancer treatment got too much for her, starting work on a second novel while seeking an agent for Counting in Danish. Sadly, she ran out of time. She was never to see her first novel in print, or complete the second. Counting in Danish has been published on the initiative of her husband, who was determined that her longheld ambition should be realised.
